Accelerator # - Driving the circular economy transition with private sector initiatives

Waste prevention, waste reduction, re-use, recycling, and recovery are at heart of a circular economy. With the EU Green Deal agenda, the circular economy is playing a gradually important role in shaping the partnership of the EU with the countries and regions of its Neighbourhood. The envisioned transition to such an economy poses challenges to established value chains, from raw materials supply, manufacturing, and recycling. Moving to a circular economy involves redesigning goods and services so that they are produced and consumed in a way that industrial and socio-economic development is non-pollutant, nowaste, low-carbon, resource efficient and socially inclusive. Entrepreneurs are key drivers in the transition to circular economy models.

The session will present stories of businesses and entrepreneurs, who have been agents of change driving the circular economy transition and creating green jobs, while at the same time developing products which preserve natural capital and biodiversity. Increasing raw materials consumption and a significant shortage of natural resource highlight, the current linear economic model is no longer viable. Stories of circular business models become even more relevant.

The Accelerator session builds on the experience gained from the implementation of programmes EU4Green, EU4Environment, Switch Med, Switch2Circular, EU/OECD Circular Economy project for the Western Balkans and many others, aiming to shift policies while also directly supporting the private sector and/or SME's behaviour and practice, towards circular and green economy patterns. It will further address knowledge and experience transfer for sharing a common vision and scaling up solutions across the private sector, including the challenges and opportunities to develop these models, as well as how to approach the European/international markets.

This Accelerator Session will start with a welcoming address by the European Commission (DG NEAR) followed by one keynote address by the OECD. The session will continue with a moderated panel discussion showcasing private sector-led initiatives that can be used as examples to achieve impact and scale for SMEs and entrepreneurs.
