Main environmental justice problems

- Disproportionate/unequal environmental burdens: SACRIFICE ZONES
- Disproportionate/unequal environmental benefits: ACCESS & USE OF WATER AND NATURAL RESOURCES

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN ENVIRONMENTAL DECISION-MAKING

 Weakness and absence of proper tools for public participation in environmental impact assessment

 Weak or no intervention of civil society (communities) in determining uses of natural resources (problems in governance).

• Equity and Climate Justice: it is the duty of the State to seek a fair allocation of burdens, costs and benefits, safeguarding the ability of future generations to satisfy their own needs, with a gender approach and special emphasis on sectors, territories, communities and ecosystems vulnerable to climate change. Climate justice seeks the fair treatment of all people, as well as avoiding the discrimination that certain policies and decisions that seek to address climate change may entail

CONCLUSIONS



ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE IN CHILE IS EVOLVING FROM AN IDEA TO A LEGAL STANDARD (DIFFERENT LEGAL PROCESSES IN COURSE)



ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATIONS DO NOT OFTEN INCLUDE RULES THAT CARE FOR THE PROBLEMS OF UNFAIR DISTRIBUTION OF ENVIRONMENTALBURDENS AND BENEFITS BETWEEN COMMUNITIES AND RELEVANT STAKEHOLDERS; RECOGNITION OF VULNERABLE COMMUNITIES; OR MEANINGFUL INVOLVEMENT MECHANISMS



DEFINITION OF NATURAL RESOURCES USES ARE DETERMINED WITHOUT AND ENVIRONMENTAL GOVERNANCE MODEL WHICH INCLUDES COORDINATION BETWEEN RELEVANT STAKEHOLDERS AND EQUITY IN ALLOCATION

STILL, THERE ARE SOME EXAMPLES OF ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE RULES AND GUIDELINES THAT CAN BE IDENTIFIED IN CHILEAN ENVIRONMENTAL LAW AND POLICY, THAT CONSIDER ITS DIFFERENT DIMENSIONS



THEREFORE ENVIRONMENTAL LAW IN CHILE IS IN THE PROCESS OF ESTABLISHING AN OBLIGATION TO INCLUDE CERTAIN RULES THAT CONSIDER ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE ELEMENTS AND APPLY TO THE ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES
